“Rakhi for Soldiers” – A Tribute of Love and Gratitude to Our Brave Soldiers

The initiative was undertaken to instill a sense of patriotism, empathy, and gratitude among students by celebrating the festival of Raksha Bandhan in a meaningful way—by sending handcrafted Rakhis to the soldiers safeguarding our nation’s borders. It served as a symbolic yet powerful gesture of bonding, love, and national pride.

Samanvaya – The Hand in Hand Club, in collaboration with IQAC and in association with Samskruti Foundation, launched the “Rakhi for Soldiers” campaign. Students from across departments participated actively by designing creative, handmade Rakhis using eco-friendly materials. A circular encouraged students to contribute to the campaign under the touching slogan, **“You tie the borders, we tie this thread—both symbols of protection and love.”** A dedicated collection desk was set up by the Club from 24th to 28th July 2025, and Rakhis poured in with heartfelt messages and intricate designs.

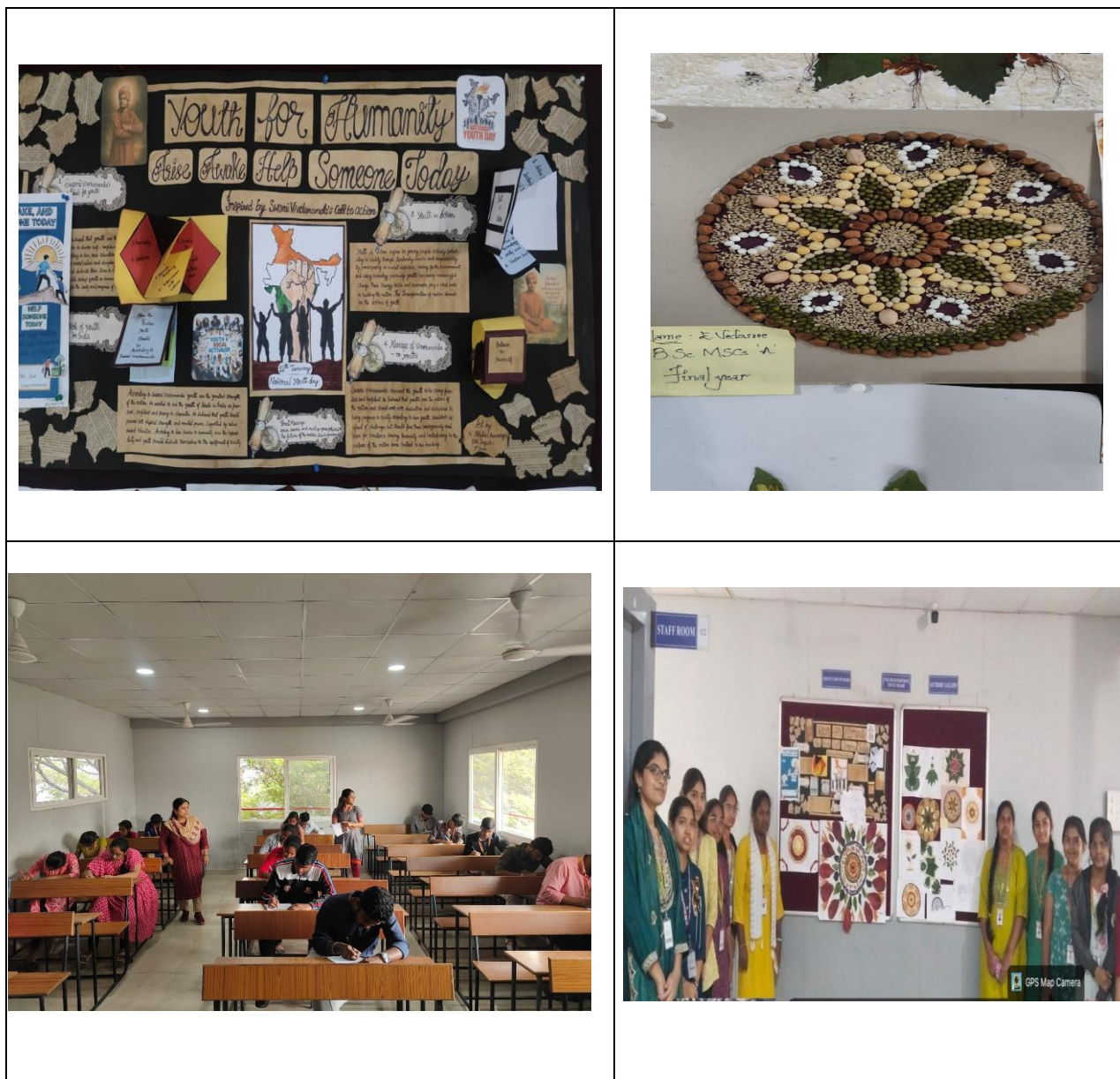
