




Report on Field Trip to Hyderabad Literary Festival 2025 –

Inaugural Session

The session on Day 1 focused on Institutional Development Plans (IDP), outlining the vision, mission, core values, and goals of an institution. The resource person elaborated on the SWOT analysis and the pivotal role of faculty in achieving institutional objectives.

On Day 2, the session was dedicated to National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), explaining its parameters such as teaching, learning, research, graduation outcomes, outreach, inclusivity, and perception. - 1. Remembering
- 2. Understanding
- 3. Applying
- 4. Analyzing
- 5. Evaluating
- 6. Creating

Participants engaged in interactive group activities to classify learning objectives within this framework. The session concluded with key takeaways and recommendations for implementing learning outcomes and assessments effectively in teaching practices.

Report on Guest Lecture by Dr. Uma Maheswari Bhrugubanda on Gender in Contemporary Society-7th February, 2025

Overview:


Dr. Uma Maheswari Bhrugubanda, a faculty member from the Department of Cultural Studies at the English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU), delivered an insightful lecture at Osmania University (OU) on the topic of "Gender in Contemporary Society." The talk explored the complex interplay of culture, politics, and social norms in shaping gender roles and identities in modern society.

Key Discussion Points:

- **Cultural Influences on Societal Roles**: Dr. Bhrugubanda examined how culture plays a significant role in defining and reinforcing societal roles, especially with regard to gender. She emphasized the need to understand gender dynamics within the framework of globalization, privatization, and political contexts.

- Vernacular Feminism: Referencing an article from The Hindu, Dr. Bhrugubanda discussed the rise of vernacular feminism, which emphasizes localized movements that address gender issues within specific cultural and regional contexts. She underscored the significance of these movements in challenging dominant, often Western-centric, feminist narratives.

Dr. Uma Maheswari Bhrugubanda's talk provided a thought-provoking analysis of gender in contemporary society, highlighting the ways in which cultural, political, and economic factors shape gender roles and identities.
